RIDERS and VOLUNTEERS

It has been another busy year for the Group filled with many highlights and successes, not just in competitions but, more importantly, for all our riders achieving their own personal goals.

Belvoir Vale RDA delivered over 775 riding opportunities to its 22 regular riders last year.

This was made possible by our wonderful team of 24 volunteers which remains a broad mix of ages and backgrounds bound together by their desire to help our disabled participants. Our younger volunteers- 7 aged under 25years- have continued their volunteering service with us, several of whom progressing to work toward their silver Duke of Edinbrough Award and Youth Equestrian Leaders Award.

PONIES

This year has seen our team of Belvoir Vale pony stars increase in number to 5 with the purchase of Alfie- an adorable welsh pony (pictured.) What he lacks in stature (he is only 12hh) he more than makes up for with his larger than life character.

He has already proved himself as a valuable asset, being a perfect poppet in the riding sessions and quickly becoming a favourite with his little charges.



Meanwhile, Pumpkin, Roma, Ali and Tommy have all given their best and we are, indeed, very fortunate to have such super ponies. We were particularly delighted when our very special pony, Roma, was awarded with his long service award. This recognises his many years helping so many disabled riders at Belvoir Vale and at Kesteven RDA.

EVENTS

The festive period was celebrated with a party involving games on ponies, lots of cake and a visit from Santa who arrived in a horse drawn carriage to the delight of all.

The winter was cold and prolonged but lessons continued whenever possible. This period was used to prepare the riders for their RDA

Proficiency tests- an invaluable way to recognise and reward achievement across all levels. ALL the riders achieved a level of competence in riding, be it sitting quietly for one circuit of the arena or riding independently. To mark these awards Matthew Dalley, the N

Midlands Rider representative was



invited to the group to present the certificates and badges.

Belvoir Vale sent riders to all 3
Regional competitions and 5 riders
qualified for the **RDA National Championships** held in July. Louisa
regained her shield for the highest
score for a Junior.

At the Championships, all the riders and ponies performed to their best and were awarded with 3 winning their classes. Sophie, riding Pumpkin, won the overall Championship for the higher score in the Countryside Challenge- amazing achievement.
